# FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

Spring is here, and with its arrival comes spring clean-up. The DPW would like to remind residents of a few items when performing spring clean-up. When raking a yard, please do not rake leaves or yard waste onto the street. Yard waste should be placed in marked vard waste containers or biodegradable bags. The garbage hauler will be picking up yard waste containers and bags on Tuesdays beginning in April to the end of November. The garbage hauler will also pick up bundled branches 1" or less in diameter. Bundles and yard waste containers cannot exceed 40lbs.

Also, beginning in April through the end of November the DPW will be chipping branches on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Monday of each month. The chipping will begin on the North side of the city working to the South. If possible, the entire city will be chipped on Mondays. If the chipping is not completed on Mondays, it will continue on Tuesdays. Please do not place brush directly onto the street as it can cause an obstruction or hazard to motorists. Branches cannot exceed 4" in diameter and brush with roots attached cannot be chipped. The City is not responsible for large amounts of brush from tree trimming, tree removal, or clearing of property. Property owners should contact a tree service for excessive brush removal.

#### FROM THE OFFICERS AND STAFF OF THE **IMLAY CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT**

Welcome to Spring. Here are some critical items to consider as you embrace and enjoy this time of year.



April, May & June bring warmer temperatures and the urge to do spring cleaning. When doing spring cleaning, some things to consider are:

1) Declutter before you clean to remove trip hazards.

2) Go mild when using cleaning products and solutions and never mix products.

3) Read the product labels before using cleaning products.

4) Open windows to provide adequate ventilation.

5) Use a mask and gloves to protect yourself from product reactions.

6) Use mops, when possible, to avoid working on your knees.

7) Allow wet floors to dry before walking on them to avoid slips and falls.

8) Store all products in a safe place out of the reach of children and pets.

9) Exercise care using a step stool; ensure it is on a solid surface. 10) Stay hydrated, drink plenty of fluids.

When doing outdoor spring cleaning, follow the same steps above. It is good practice to enlist professional help when performing risky tasks, such as cleaning gutters, pruning trees, working on ladders, etc. If you gather dead twigs and branches, ensure you know your area's rules before burning these items. Please ensure you get a burn permit and watch the fire while it is entirely extinguished and cool.

#### Social District:

This spring and summer, residents and guests are



encouraged to get out and enjoy the numerous shops and

restaurants our area has to offer. Now that the social district was approved by the commission in the form of a resolution, those who are 21 and over can purchase alcohol from several participating social district establishments downtown and walk up and down downtown Third Street and Almont with a certified social district cup.

Commons areas also include Concerts in the Park, Farmers Market, train watching and window shopping.

#### **Door-to-Door Peddlers/Solicitors:**

When the weather breaks the peddlers will follow. Persons peddling door-to-door selling goods or services must be licensed with the City and have photo identification issued by the City Clerk's Office. Persons may only peddle/solicit between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. There are certain groups that are exempt from the City's licensing provisions, however they still should be able to provide photo ID from their respective organizations and are asked to comply with local time requirements. For questions on licensing, contact the City Clerk's Office at 810-724-2135. If you do not wish to have peddlers/solicitors, come to your door, consider posting a "no peddling/no soliciting" sign on your property. The permit process requires applicants to submit to a background check for review by the Police Department.
