FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

Last year, the City applied and received a 100% grant from the Michigan Health Endowment Fund to design pathway extensions with sidewalk improvements. The design is progressing, and the current proposed project would start at the Maple Grove community, north on Almont Avenue to Cheney Street, where existing sidewalks would be replaced. Also, it would include a connection to the Polly Ann Trail at the Middle School. The sidewalks along Monica Boulevard in Maple Grove, and on both sides of Cheney Street would be 5 foot. The pathway along Almont Avenue and the connection to the Polly Ann Trail would be 8 foot. The City and Imlay City Schools have teamed up and are currently working with the Michigan Fitness Foundation with the goal to submit a Safe Routes to School Program application this fall. There is an opportunity for the City to receive \$300,000 per school towards the construction of the project. The Schools will assist with walks, surveys, maps, reports, and align the work with student family schedules. The scope of the project may change based on results from the surveys, etc. This is a great opportunity for the City and School District to work together and improve the walkability in the community and to school.

Welcome to summer! A couple of facts to consider regarding children and water safety. Drowning is the highest cause of death in children aged 1–4, and the second highest cause of death in children aged 5-14. Teens and young adults often don't think about water



Teens and young adults often don't think about water safety and end up in an unsafe situation without realizing it.

Some safety precautions to remember are:

- 1) Don't go in deep water unless you know how to swim.
- 2) Never swim alone.
- 3) Learn CPR and Rescue Techniques.
- 4) Make sure the body of water matches your skill level.
- 5) Swim in lifeguard-supervised areas.
- 6) Don't push or jump on others.
- 7) Don't dive in unfamiliar areas.
- 8) Never drink alcohol when swimming.
- 9) Never leave your child alone.

10) Lifeguards aren't babysitters; always keep your eyes on your child.

Parks & Recreation

The Polly Ann Trail is Imlay City's only linear park. The Polly Ann Trail in Lapeer County is a 20-mile long former rail corridor

from Boardman Road to Kings Mill, passing through multiple townships and cities! In 2012, the Friends of the Polly Ann Trail group donated over \$6,000 for the construction of a trailhead which includes a gravel parking lot, two



benches, a message board, hitching posts and trash barrels. Imlay City has paved 0.7 miles of the trail that passes through the city, provided light fixtures, and cameras for additional public safety. The Polly Ann Trail in Lapeer County has provided a variety of benefits for area residents and the economy. It encourages cleaner travel by providing nearly 20-mile non-motorized corridor for safe passage for walkers, runners, bicyclists, equestrians and cross country skiers.
