## FROM THE OFFICERS AND STAFF OF THE IMLAY CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT

Welcome to fall! The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) is focusing its fire prevention mission this fall on Lithium-Ion Battery Safety in your home.



Lithium-ion batteries store a large amount of energy in a small package. These batteries can overheat, start a fire, or explode if overcharged or damaged. Lithium-ion batteries are found in numerous devices, including but not limited to: e-bikes and vehicles, hover boards, power tools, laptops, cell phones, tablets, toys, remote control cars, drones, headphones, flashlights, e-vapes, and more.

Some safety precautions to remember are:

- 1) Buy only listed products that have batteries with a certification mark such as UL, ETL, or CSA. This signifies that batteries meet recognized safety standards and testing.
- 2) Charge devices safely. Always use the cables that came with the product and follow the manufacturer's instructions for charging. Use on manufacturer-approved charger accessories.
- 3) Charge your device on a hard surface at temperatures between 32°F and 105°F.
- 4) Don't overcharge the device, remove it from the charger when it is fully charged.
- 5) Stop using the device if the battery gets uncomfortably hot to the touch, makes popping noises, changes in shape, color, or has visible damage. Move the device to a safe location outside the home.
- 6) Recycle your device or batteries responsibly. Do not throw in the trash or recycle bins.

## FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

The DPW will continue brush pick-up on the first and third Monday of each month, until the end of November. **Curbside leaf pickup is scheduled to begin Monday, October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2025.** NORTH of the railroad tracks will be picked-up on Mondays, and SOUTH of the railroad tracks will be picked-up on Tuesdays. Tuesday, November 25<sup>th</sup>, will be the last day of curbside leaf pickup. Please do not place leaves onto the street until a few days before the start date. This will keep streets clear and safe, and allow the DPW to sweep streets until leaf pick-up begins. As a reminder, leaves CAN be bagged for pickup by the City's waste hauler, from April to the end of November. The only time leaves are permitted to be placed onto the street is from the middle of October, through the end of November.
