FROM THE DESK OF ED PRIEHS, DPW SUPERINTENDENT

Winter is here, NO PARKING on the streets:

November 15th, 2025 till April 15th, 2026 from 2:30 AM till 6:00 AM

City residents and businesses should be aware or reminded of an amendment in 2023 to the Code of Ordinances: General Regulations – Snow Emergencies Ordinance No. 8.2C. In the Ordinance, the City may declare a Snow Emergency if forecasted weather conditions make it necessary that motor vehicle traffic be expedited and that parking on the streets of the City be prohibited or restricted for snow plowing and other purposes. The City will announce such parking prohibitions or restrictions on all communication outlets at its disposal. The parking prohibitions will commence one hour after declaration of a snow emergency. Parking prohibitions will remain in effect until terminated by announcement of the City. Also, during or after all snow events, please do not plow, blow, shovel, or place snow onto or across the street. It is against the law and is dangerous for all motorists. When this occurs, it removes or weakens the effectiveness of de-icing materials that have been applied to the streets. Piles of snow and ice left in streets can cause damage to vehicles and snow removal equipment. Please be patient, and do not drive close to salt trucks and snow removal equipment. These trucks and equipment will back-up from time to time during salting and snow removal operations. Thank you for your cooperation, the DPW is committed to streets and roads in the City being clear and safe for all motorists.



FROM THE OFFICERS AND STAFF OF THE IMLAY CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT

Welcome to Winter and all the weather conditions it brings.



Wintertime can bring challenging, ever-changing driving conditions. During bad weather, the first question you need to ask yourself is, "Do I need to go out and travel in it today?" A change in plans may be a better, safer option than navigating in poor weather.

If you can't avoid travelling in poor weather conditions, some items to prepare for driving in winter are:

- 1) Check your tires to make sure they are in good condition, have the correct tread and rubber type, and are filled with proper pressure.
- 2) Check your wiper blades to make sure they are in good condition and are working correctly. Also, make sure you have plenty of washer fluid in the reservoir and extra in your vehicle.
- 3) Keep your car stocked with essentials, including a snow brush, scraper, and portable shovel. You may even want to consider having jumper cables and some Mylar blankets on hand.
- 4) Warm your car up enough to make sure the snow and ice are cleared from your windows.
- 5) Most importantly, give yourself more than adequate time to get to your destination. This is not the time to rush or be impatient with other vehicles on the road.

Remember, make the most of the drive, be patient, and stay safe.
