C. Water Rate Study - Stantec Financial

Jim Bearman and Leticia Gaglianone from Stantec Financial Services, gave a power point presentation on the Water and Sewer Rate studies for the City of Imlay City. The study was comprised of utility bills, water and sewer fund budgets, and water purchase costs from GLWA. The City of Imlay City has not raised water/sewer rates in five years. Based on the outcome of the study, Stantec has suggested rate increases for the Fiscal years 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 as follows:

Vlasic 20% Water Rate increase Residents 9% Vlasic 9% Sewer Rate increase Residents 9%

Fiscal Year 2020-2021 and following years are projected to have an increase of 4%.

The information will be considered and the City Manager will be meeting with Vlasic to discuss these proposed increases.

A vote on the increase will be done at the next Commissioners meeting Oct 2, 2018.

D. 2018 Charitable Gaming License

Imlay City High School would like to have a fundraiser for Project Graduation. This fundraiser would be in the form of a raffle for items such as: Yeti Meat Cooler, Rifles, Meat Package, \$50 Gift Cards, and other donated items.
