- B. Rowe presentation for discussion of Parks and Recreation plan. Additions to the Lions Park include: trail to connect from Polly Ann Trail from Belle River observation deck, a trail around the edge of park, the northern border on the west side is inaccurate and upgrading sports fields. Rotary Park is the smallest park. Additions to the Veterans Park include: an additional fitness station and a flag and veterans memorial utilizing a DNR grant. Additions to the Lamb Steele Park and Alvin Norlin Memorial Pool and Splash Pad include: lift for the pool, building upgrades and accessibility for ADA compliance. Additions and corrections to the Old School Park include: new playscape with accessible elements, update grills and Old School is not the smallest park. Corrections for the Polly Ann Trail include: the trailhead has been completed, lighting has been added to deter vandalism and Frank Demske will forward trailhead pictures to Rowe. The community garden and pedestrian path was removed from fairgrounds. A butterfly garden has been developed and needs to be maintained. The Pathway system map should include the butterfly garden, the fairgrounds should be depicted in another color as well as the school properties in yet another color.
